Medical Legal Committee: Summary of Article entitled "Virginia Law Revised to Enhance Health Care Decision-Making Rights"

"On July 1, 2009, Virginia's law will change to expand the types of decisions an individual can make with an advance directive. The changes also address the

following: assessment of decision-making capacity; authority of health care agents; situations where a patient who lacks decision-making capacity protests care recommendations; revocation of documents expressing care decisions; and protection of decision-makers and providers who act in good faith to carry out patient directions.

The revisions were recommended by the Supreme Court of Virginia's Commission on Mental Health Law Reform to create additional legal authority for individuals to give instructions about their health care, especially if they anticipate losing their decision-making capacity due to dementia or other mental health conditions and wish to give advance instructions about their future health care, including mental health care.

Under the expanded law, an individual can give instructions in his advance directive about all forms of health care (not just end-of-life care as is currently the case) even if he has not named an agent to make decisions for him when he cannot make them for himself. This means that, with an advance directive, a person can now express his choices about mental health care, health care facility admission, maintenance treatments such as dialysis and insulin treatment, or any other health care. (*§§ 54.1-2983 and 54.1-2984*)

An advance directive, a free form, based on the model suggested under Virginia's law (*§54.1-2984*), is available at <http://www.vsb.org/site/public/healthcare-decisions-day>. UPCOMING LEGISLATIVE CHANGES; PROPER DOCKET FOR “SEPARATE BUT IN SAME HOUSE” DIVORCES

Upcoming legislative changes

Unfortunately, the General Assembly got around to amending § 20-60.3 this year, and made major changes. There will now be a total of seventeen notices. Most of the new notices just consolidate information from elsewhere in the code (such as how long support must be paid, driver's license suspension for nonpayment, etc.). If you do any domestic relations work, please take a look at the new statute at <http://leg1.state.va.us> (run a search in “Bills and Resolutions” under “Searchable Databases”). Be sure to read the statutes cross-referenced in the amended § 20-60.3 so that you provide all required information in your orders.

A number of changes were made to the adoption statutes as well. Procedures are now provided for court approval of a “post-adoption contact and communication agreement.” This creates a way to make the traditionally informal agreements between adoptive parents and birth parents to share information about the child. Any such agreement must be incorporated into the final order of adoption. See new § 63.2-1228.1 for the details and requirements.

Some changes were made to the requirements for consent to adoption. If the birth parent has to be served with the petition, he or she will now have only fifteen days to respond, instead of twenty-one. If consent is not required because a birth parent is deceased, that must be established by filing the death certificate with the court. These changes are in amended § 63.2-1203. Similarly, if the adoption must be commenced in the juvenile and domestic relations court, and the father's identity is known but not his location, then the petitioners must provide proof of compliance with the Putative Father Registry. § 63.2-1233(1)(b). If both the identity and location of the birth father *are* known, then he must be given notice

of the adoption plan and information about the Putative Father Registry by certified mail. He then has ten days from the date of mailing to register. § 63.2-1250(E).

Finally, the process will speed up slightly where interlocutory orders are required. The supervisory visits can be made within the six-month period immediately after the child was placed, rather than waiting until after entry of the interlocutory order. § 63.2-1212(A).

New rules for hearing requests where it appears the parties are still residing in the same house

In recent months, a number of divorce files have been submitted for hearing request approval where it is apparent that the parties may be separated, but are still living in the same residence. The judges have decided that these files are not appropriate for the uncontested divorce/hearing request docket. Instead, divorce files where the parties are separated but still living in the same residence must be set for hearing on the Friday Contested Divorce Docket. Proof of actual separation must be provided at the hearing.

Along with giving notice of this change, the judges asked me to remind attorneys of their ethical duties in general, and under Rule 3:3 of the Rules of Professional Conduct, to be truthful to the court. So be straight with the facts even if it lands you on the Friday docket!

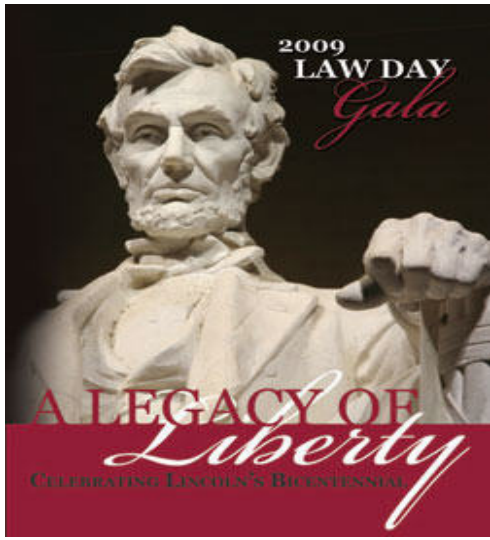
