A double thank-you to Kathleen, who also worked to organize this event along with Jerry Harris of our Circuit Court Liaison committee.

We were also excited to establish a new Corporate & Transactional Practice committee, diligently guided by Lamont Maddox and Kyle Korte, which put together a terrific CLE on the new tax laws at the Meyera Oberndorf Central Library. And our JDR Court Liaison committee, led by Christianna Dougherty-Cunningham and Bretta Lewis, continued to set the standard for sheer volume of committee work in delivering an extensive portfolio of CLE and other offerings.

I would be remiss if I did not specifically thank each of our board members for their faithful service this year. Brandon Zeigler as

Immediate Past President and Jon Stone as President-Elect did whatever was asked of them cheerfully and effectively, and provided extensive wise counsel along the way. Secretary Chris Jacobs kept the communications rolling, both with weekly emails and quarterly newsletters, while Treasurer Christy Wood maintained our finances on track and in clear view. A special thank you to our two newest directors, Ed Booth and Ryan Ferguson, who carried a particularly heavy load this year as we had extensive CLE programming for which they had primary responsibility, including next week's Introduction to Courts CLE, which was developed with the assistance of Laura McQuesten, Brad Hudgins and Megan Casey.

Finally, the Board's signature achievement this year was hiring our new Executive Director, Kathy Stull. Kathy has proven to have boundless energy and capability, and she has embraced every challenge thrown her way. She has already been hugely helpful in sorting out our membership database, keeping our web page updated, and bringing in-house the process of sending member emails. Toward that end, if any of you are having difficulty receiving our weekly emails or any other types of communications, please contact her and she will troubleshoot whatever issues you may be facing. She has also incorporated our financial processes into more modern accounting software, and has been a cheerful and helpful presence at almost all of our events since she started with us in June.

We are happy to conclude this year with another terrific tradition, our Annual Holiday Party! We look forward to seeing each of you at Tautog's and celebrating the season together. It has been an exciting year for our board, and I know I speak for all of us in saying thank you for this extraordinary opportunity to serve.

CONCERNED LAWYERS ADVOCATING SPOUSAL SAFETY (C.L.A.S.S.)





To: The Virginia Beach Bar Association RE: Civil Motions Practice and Docketing

As most of you know, we now have five full time Juvenile & Domestic Relations Court Judges, down from the seven that we had for over a decade and until 2017. Consequently, we've had to make adjustments in our docketing system, particularly as it pertains to civil motions hearings. This memo is meant to be a reminder as to how much time is assigned to each hearing so that attorneys can prepare their cases and their clients accordingly. Initial/New Petitions (CIVN): New custody/visitation filings and motions to amend visitation (what we commonly refer to as "first time in" hearings) are assigned seven minutes on the docket. Routinely, these hearings are when a GAL is appointed if appropriate and the pretrial hearing and trial dates are set. Understanding that trial dates are often not available until four or five months after the initial hearing, if either party wishes to present evidence at this hearing or is seeking a temporary order that is not agreed upon by all parties, such motion would have to be filed separately as a motion for an expedited hearing. Civil Motions (CIVM): Motion hearings, including, but not limited to motions to expedite and motions for emergency hearings, are assigned 15 minutes on the docket. Often, attorneys or parties will file several motions and request that those motions are added to the docket on a date and time where another motion involving the same parties has already been scheduled. Please understand that each of these motions is supposed to be assigned an additional 15 minutes, and there often isn't enough time on a given docket for the court to hear multiple motions. If you are filing multiple motions to be heard on a given day, please indicate such with the clerk so that an appropriate amount of time can be assigned. If your requested time is not available, motions may be split between two separate dockets. We have attempted to accommodate the Bar by adding a specific motions docket between the hours of 10am and 11am on each judge's duty docket. As noted above, each motion that is filed is granted 15 minutes, so a total of four motions can be scheduled during that period of time. If you have already been assigned a time slot during one of these dockets, please note that there often will not be sufficient time to add additional, later-filed motions to the same time slot. A motion for an expedited hearing is given a default of 15 minutes of time on the docket. These hearings are meant for the attorneys or parties to present evidence and argument as to whether or not a hearing may be expedited and set on an earlier date. The setting of a motion for an expedited hearing does not automatically mean the decision to expedite the case has been or will be granted. Nor should it be seen as an opportunity to "skip the line" by having the matter set for a contested hearing directly from the day the motion is heard, without having the initial hearing. If the court determines that the case should be expedited, then a date will be set at the conclusion of the motion hearing. A motion for an emergency hearing, which is typically requested to be heard ex parte, will typically only be granted in cases of some imminent threat to the safety or welfare of a child, or for some equally serious reason. As with motions for expedited hearings, these matters are fact-specific and the mere fact that such a motion is filed does not guarantee that an emergency hearing will be granted, and if it is not, the entire matter will be set on the next available docket for the court, to include any collateral motions such as appointing a Guardian Ad Litem. We strive as a court to be responsive to the needs of the Bar and the public despite current limited resources and greatly appreciate your cooperation.
