VIRGINIA: IN THE JUVENILE AND DOMESTIC RELATIONS DISTRICT COURT OF THE CITY OF VIRGINIA BEACH

ORDER

Upon a State of Emergency declared by both the President of the United States and the Governor of Virginia, a Supreme Court of Virginia Order Declaring a Judicial Emergency, and upon consideration of guidelines issued relative to public safety by Federal, State and Local agencies due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it is

ORDERED pursuant to the Supreme Court of Virginia's Order Declaring a Judicial Emergency and §16.1-69.35(5), there will be limited access from Tuesday, March 17, 2020 to April 6, 2020. All cases are hereby continued with the exception of the following cases:

- a. Arraignments and bond motions for incarcerated adults on criminal cases and contempt proceedings;
- b. Detention hearings for juveniles securely detained;
- c. Abuse & Neglect hearings requesting Emergency Removal Orders and Preliminary Child Protective Orders and 5-day hearings for these cases; and
- d. Preliminary Protective Order requests.

All currently scheduled adjudicatory or preliminary hearings for any incarcerated defendant or juvenile in detention will be held as a review of bond or detention status hearing.

Whenever possible these hearings will be conducted by video or telephonically or based on the pleadings alone.
